Fortunately, an adopter named Penny took a chance on this timid girl. Here's what Penny said Camilla's first three days were like in her new home:

Day #1- She was very fearful of every little noise, but I completely expected that. I set her up in a spare bedroom to decompress, but I kept checking in on her and she was very receptive to each visit. She started eating and drinking right away. On one of my trips to check on her, she managed to pull a Houdini and slip out and ran to the living room. She somehow found a way to squeeze herself under the sofa, but I eventually put her back in her "safe room" for the night since I had everything set up in there.

Day #2-My husband gets up super early for work and said she was meowing and scratching at the door when she heard him. I got up about an hour later and decided to let her out to explore the downstairs. She's still scared of the different sounds, but she is eating, drinking and using the litter box with no issues.

Day #3- What scared, timid cat?? I'm leaving the footrests up on the sofa all the time so she can scoot in when she gets fearful, but she is really coming out of her shell. She LOVES being brushed and rolls and flips and shows me her cute little belly all the time, which I know is a sign of trust. She's a marathon runner when I get the laser pointer out, and she is a bit nutty when I put catnip on her toys. She's already fearless and tried to climb a bookshelf...knocking several books off in the process. She loves laying in the sun, watching the birds, and wants to be in whatever room we are in.

I wanted to let you know that I am completely in love with this little girl. Thank you for taking such good care of her for the beginning of her life. I'm convinced that she was waiting for me to scoop her up and bring her home.

Ciri – DOB approx July 2022. She has been here since January 2025. She loves to be the center of attention! She likes being with people (but does not like other cats), so she should be the only cat in the house. She loves sitting in a window to watch outside and playing with spinning balls, toys on a stick and other toys that stimulate her brain. Ciri needs someone to give her a lot of playtime and feline enrichment!



Stephen - DOB 2025. He is a very curious and playful kitty who needs to be the only cat in the home. All he wants is human attention, so if you can have only one cat, this could be the guy for you! He was rescued off the city streets after an apparent injury from being hit by a car. He had a hip fracture and injured tail, and he was brought to us for neuter and tail amputation in February 2026. Stephen is now back to his normal playful self, and although he is over a year old, he still acts like a kitten!



Chance- DOB 2020. He came to us in October 2025, found as a stray in another county. Since coming to the shelter, he has been treated and cured of FIP, a potentially deadly disease, and has passed the monitoring period to make sure the treatments worked. He is now healthy and would like a chance to be your special boy and have you to himself, for playing, petting, and companionship. He is FeLV negative/FIV positive and he is on Prescription HA food. Chance loves to play and chase toys around his room and to sit in the window watching the birds. He hasn't shown that he particularly likes other cats, so he would need to be an only cat. Emerson – DOB approx January 2025. He is a very sweet and friendly guy with black medium hair and a gorgeous plummy tail. He was found as a stray outside a lady's home and would sit on her lap on her porch. She knew he was too friendly to be in a feral colony, so he came to us in February 2026. He gets along with other cats and would make a great addition to your family!



Violet – DOB 2025. She is a very sweet and active young gal. She came to us in May 2026, and at first she just wanted to stay in her caboodle. Now she has come out of her shell and likes to interact with people! She is a sweetheart who gets along with other calm cats.



Catarina- DOB approx 2023. She is a quiet, friendly gal found outside June 2026. She mostly stays to herself in a room with 8 other cats, but once she is given quiet attention, she loves it! She loves petting and would most likely do well in a quiet home. She would be OK with a non-aggressive cat and older patient children.



Princess (FeLV+) - DOB 2016. This gray and white tuxedo girl is FeLV+/ FIV+, but she has the regressive form of leukemia. She's not on any special medicine or food, uses the litter box like a lady, likes to play with her toys, and gets along well with the other kitties in the leukemia cottage. She follows volunteers around looking for pets and loving and she has been at the shelter since May 2025. She could be paired with another leukemia cat or would be fine as a single cat. Princess is an appropriate name for this cutie because she's calm and regal and ready to be loved!

You Can't Keep a Good Cat Down!

It's amazing just how resilient cats can be. Just look at Chuckie, a 13-year-old kitty who has been a resident at Forgotten Felines and Fidos since 2015. Back in February, volunteers noticed that he was limping around the room. After the medical team examined him, it was determined that he had fractured all of his metatarsal bones in his left hind leg. The metatarsal bones connect the ankle to the toes, and cats have five of them. No one is certain how the fracture happened, but it was clear that immediate action was needed.



Because of Chuckie's age and the severity of the fracture, the decision was made to amputate the leg. We were all very nervous to see how Chuckie would do, but amazingly he adjusted almost immediately. He now jumps up on the cat trees, he uses the cat steps to go up into his crate at night (so he can eat his prescription thyroid food) and he still enjoys going outside on the patio. Chuckie is now feeling great and living life to the fullest with his friends in the Wild Side. We adopted our cat "Harry" who is formerly known as "Amos" at the end of May 2026. Our family is the perfect example of a "foster failure" adoption. We started fostering Harry because we needed to see how he got along with our 12-year-old pitbull Luna. Luna had lived with cats almost her whole life in our home, but we had lost one a few years ago to old age. I volunteer on Friday mornings at FFF and I would always see Amos/Harry at the front door of the barn at FFF. Eight years ago, someone brought our neighbor a tabby kitty who they said was inappropriately urinating in the house, so she kept him as a barn cat. He was strictly an outdoor cat because he would not use the litterbox properly, but he was always a favorite among the volunteers/staff at the shelter.

This past winter he was temporarily transferred to a volunteer's garage because of an impending snowstorm. His partner in crime Tigger (who also came from our neighbor's barn) also went along for the ride. After living in the garage, I think they both decided it was nicer living somewhere safe and warm, and they both started using the litterbox properly! Amos/Harry then began living inside in "The Playpen" room that I worked in on Friday mornings. He quickly became one of my favorites in that room. He always greeted me at the door and was always looking for a pet or a lap to sit on. When he became a member of our family, his true personality emerged. He became even sweeter and more affectionate. We changed his name to "Harry" because like Houdini he was always trying to run out the door when someone came in or went out. He had lived outside for 8 years, so I can understand old habits are sometimes hard to break. He is getting used to living with our dog Luna and sometimes they will even touch noses while they are both sleeping on the couch. I really hope that they eventually become true friends. His favorite things to do include playing with his catnip mice and looking out the window to watch the birdfeeder. He has us well trained at dispensing cat treats when he bellows for them. His favorite thing to do though is to sit on our laps and "make biscuits" on a blanket. We are so blessed that he has joined our family!
