



## A Volunteer Story by Lori P.



It was a lovely day for a mental health crisis. The sun was out, the birds were singing, and we were sitting on a covered porch, shaded from the heat. My kid was trying to tell me what no parent wants to hear - that they were depressed, that they had no direction, that they didn't want to wake up in the morning. There is perhaps no better antidote to the confusion that is adolescent life than helping others, so I started to think about what kind of service could help to lift my ailing child out of this malaise. Well, petting a cat releases endorphins in the human brain that can lower blood pressure and raise dopamine levels (plus being around cats just makes everything feel better!). This research crossed my mind as I processed my child's misery.

Fast forward about two years, and it's Saturday morning. Barnabas, the cat we adopted from Forgotten Felines, takes up half the couch in our living room as he hugs his kicker toy, fast asleep. We're about to head in to volunteer as weekend cleaners, so we give him a quick scratch and tell him we'll say hi to his friends. Life is full of surprises. Just as Barnabas expected to spend the rest of his life lounging in the Senior room, we met him and knew he needed to come home with us. Just as Soren used to sleep until noon, wake up and meander about the day listlessly, we started volunteering Saturdays and Sundays at the shelter. I no longer have to drag the kid out of bed. Ever. The kid wakes me at 7:30 to tell me that it's time to go. Forgotten Felines gave Soren a safe place where they not only found a love for the creatures that would understand them, befriend them, and accept them, but also a direction. After volunteering for a few months, Soren found opportunities to move into an educational vet tech program at the technical school. Suddenly, high school felt less awful, and life felt more purposeful.

Volunteering at the shelter connected us with people who are kind, who care about animals, and who also get out of bed early on a Saturday or a Sunday to show up for the organization. It's hard not to have a house full of cats when you fall in love over and over again, but Forgotten Felines makes it easier. The cats you love will be there, or they will be adopted out to their forever home. There isn't a high turnover rate that might result in improper placement. If a cat has special needs or medical issues, then they become a resident- and that's okay because the residents live healthy lives with excellent vet care. Soren and I look forward to our time at the shelter (even the cleaning). I'm so grateful not only for the love of our elderly ebony gentleman Barnabas, but also for the education, for the community, and for the therapeutic value of helping the residents of the barn and the house.
